Reflections for This Week

As usual, the great Season of Advent begins, not by talking about Christmas, but about the Second Coming. We've had this theme already for the past two weeks, but there is a slight change of emphasis in the Scripture readings offered for this Sunday: here the tone is positive: it is the "promise" of what is to come that we contemplate. Even in the Gospel, though it talks of the dreadful signs that mark the end times, we hear of a promise - "liberation". For this we should stand erect and hold our heads high. The central theme is that we welcome the coming of a person - Jesus Christ, the promised Messiah, and this is what links this Sunday to the coming feast of his birth: we are now preparing to celebrate how he once came: may these preparations also help us to prepare for him when he comes again!

Marriage Matters: *Keeping the star of our love burning brightly:* Jeremiah's joy reminds us of the weeks before our wedding, a time when we were deeply aware of our love for one another. Since then, many cares have threatened to divert us from that love and it has sometimes been necessary to make a special effort to share, listen and forgive to keep the star of our love burning brightly.

Think Vocation: As we enter into the season of Advent, let us use the New Year in the life of the Church to consider what God is calling each one of us to do with our lives.

Parking Near Ss Peter and Paul: Residents in the area around SsPP Church will have received notice of a planned extension of the residents parking scheme and the possible introduction of digital permits rather than printed ones. As part of the expansion of the scheme to more streets, it is also proposed that the existing parking restrictions on Park Road (and other nearby streets) will change from being Monday to Friday (9am to 5pm) to being 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
