### **Reflections for This Week**

It may seem strange, but this is a Christmas Feast. Strange if we think of Christmas only in terms of the Baby in Bethlehem, but not if we have followed the ideas of the Feasts of Holy Family and especially Epiphany, and have seen the Season in terms of the growing manifestation or appearing of the Son of God: first to the shepherds and then to the wise men from the East. Now in the River Jordan, Jesus, Son of Mary, is revealed to all as the fullness of all God's promises: "You are my beloved Son". On this day we stand before the revelation of God's love for us, such that he would send his only Son into the world. Christmas without the Baptism of the Lord, and the words that are spoken from heaven, would be incomplete, since it is only in them that we fully see the wonder of what happened in Bethlehem. As we come to the end of Christmas today, and look forward to hearing the Gospels in Ordinary Time, we do so having been shown who it is we listen to: the only Son of God, the Beloved.

Marriage Matters: Being what we promised to be: Today's feast tells us who Jesus really is; it calls us to be what we promised at our wedding — a sign to the world of God's love for all of us. At the core of this commitment is the undertaking to trust our spouse with who we really are — feelings, thoughts, ideas; all that makes us who we are today.

**Think Vocation:** At baptism, when we entered the family of God, we received the gift of faith as well as the promise of eternal life. Let us try to find out the name of the priest or deacon who baptised us (if we don't already know) and pray for them whether they are living or deceased.
